

Keep It Burning Bright

In todays' Gospel, Matthew refers to the wisdom and foolishness of life. Using a specific example of the story of ten virgins going to a wedding feast. Among them, five were wise and five were foolish. But only the "Top 5 wise ladies" were able to welcome the bridegroom and attend the wedding feast. the Gospel sets us a value that must be chosen. It is choosing to be wise in the human way or in the God's way. The wisdom of the Kingdom of Heaven is the attitude of readiness and alertness, living fully in the present moment, fulfilling daily duties with love.

On the day of baptism, the lamp of faith of each of us was lit. This lamp must first illuminate so that we can recognize the face of a God full of love. The New Testament sacrament of baptism does not have the main content of repentance to have all sins wiped away, but to know God's salvation and his unconditional love and mercy to humanity. As long as the lamp burns brightly, I can still recognize Him in the dark. The Groom can suddenly appear, he can come from anywhere, at any time... "There's the groom, come meet him".
